## **Foreword**

Lexis, an e-journal boasting an International Scientific Committee (ISSN 1951-6215), publishes papers on the English lexicon written from both synchronic and diachronic perspectives, in the form of two annual thematic issues, as well as book reviews and a number of special issues containing conference proceedings. It is hosted in France by the Groupe de Recherche en Linguistique Anglaise (GRLA), Centre d'Etudes Linguistiques (CEL), Jean Moulin University – Lyon 3. It has already published four issues: issue #1 dealt with "Polysemy", issue #2 with "Lexical Submorphemics", issue #3 with "Borrowing", and special issue #1 was devoted to the links between "Lexicology and phonology".
